Commission directed TANGEDCO to file an undertaking setting out schedule of payments before 28.03.2023. Case adjourned to 28.03.2023 for further hearing.

A representation was made by each one of the counsel appearing for the petitioners that cases in which fee payable has been paid in full or in part, can be listed together since the query raised by the Registry on the basis of the audit objection as to whether the petitions have to be classified as Dispute Resolution Petition (D.R.P.) or Miscellaneous Petition and with regard to the sufficiency of the payment of fee paid

can be decided by the Commission during the course of enquiry and that if the Commission ultimately decides that the fees already paid is not sufficient or proper, the Commission is always at liberty to pass orders in respect of payment of deficit fee in its final order. The counsel appearing for TANGEDCO represented that in respect of petitions in which no fee has been paid and no representation is made for the past several hearings final notice may be issued to the respective petitioners indicating that if minimum fee is not paid within the next hearing date, appropriate orders will be passed. Considering the power vested with the Commission to pass appropriate orders / suitable directions in the final order with regard to payment of deficit fee, if any and to ensure speedy disposal of the cases, this Commission directs the Registry that the cases in which entire fee or minimum prescribed fee has been paid shall be listed together without insisting payment of deficit fee. In respect of cases where no fee has not been paid, a final notice calling upon the petitioners to pay the requisite fee within 15 days from the date of receipt of notice shall be issued by the Registry. Further as suggested by the Counsel for TANGEDCO, which was fairly conceded by the Counsel for each one of the petitioners, a consolidated paper book in respect of all cases shall be filed on behalf of all the petitioner by nominating a Co-ordinating Counsel to facilitate the counsel appearing for the respondent, TANGEDCO to respond effectively to all the issues and for effective and speedy disposal of the cases by a common order. The petitioners are directed to nominate a co-ordinating counsel for filing a consolidated typedset on or before 11.04.2023 and serve the same on the respondent as well as on all the other petitioners. Rejoinders, if any, are permitted to be filed along with the consolidated typedset. By consent of all the counsel, case posted to 18.04.2023 for arguments.
